# STAR WORDS: AN EPIPHANY TRADITION

The spiritual practice of receiving a Star Word is an Epiphany tradition that has emerged in many churches in recent years.

You are invited to use your Star Word, prayerfully, as a guiding word for the year. The word chooses the recipient, and not the other way around! The Star Word may serve as an intention word, enabling us to see God in ways that we might not have seen God before. Star Words invite us to commune with God through reflection and contemplation. We receive Star Words as one receives a gift, with wonder and curiosity. We turn our desire to control over to God and allow God to bless us with insight.

On **Sunday, January 11<sup>th</sup>**, Epiphany “King Cake” will be served at Holy Grounds. You may receive a Star Word from Pastor Meg at that time. Star Words will also be available in Meg’s office during the weeks of **Mon., January 12<sup>th</sup>** and **Mon., January 19<sup>th</sup>**.

# Save the Date - February 4th



Wednesday, February 4th at 6:30 p.m. in Fellowship Hall Dr. Ivan Rusyn, President and Professor of Mission at the Ukrainian Evangelical Theological Seminary will be with us to share his experiences of serving Christ in Ukraine during a time of war.

When Russia invaded Ukraine in late February of 2022, Dr. Rusyn helped rush his seminary faculty, staff and students away from the artillery and missile strikes while he and other key administrators bunkered down a mere 1,000 feet from the Russian front lines to assist those who couldn't leave.

From that first day of the war, Rusyn and his team have been actively involved in a relief ministry, providing care to those suffering from the atrocities of war because "the church cannot serve people without being among the people. We have to walk the same path."
