CALL Student to Attend Moore County Innovative High School at Sandhills Community College this Fall

Sarahi Morales, an eighth grader at Southern Middle will attend the innovative high school at Sandhills Community College. The school provides an accelerated learning model in a personalized environment on the campus of Sandhills.



All academic courses will be taught at the Honors Level in small classes with support. The rigor of these classes will ensure students are ready for college-level coursework in the Junior and Senior years of high school. Our program will provide students the opportunity to complete career certifications, credentials, and/or an associate degree alongside the high school diploma. Students may attend for up to five years before graduating.

Moore County Schools is committed to meeting the educational needs of all students, including those with special abilities and talents. Their belief is that students with special gifts, talents, and high interests are found in all ethnic, geographic, and socioeconomic groups, and they represent a source of potential innovation, creativity, and leadership. Without appropriate educational opportunities, the superior talents and abilities of many of these students would remain undeveloped or underdevelopment.

It is their responsibility to provide an appropriate and challenging educational program, grounded in the recognition of individual differences and unique learning styles, and provided within an environment that encourages and nurtures inquiry, flexibility, and divergent thinking.

Mission Committee

I still look forward to summer as if I'm a kid in school! The excitement for this season harkens back to long, leisurely warm days at the pool. However, for many children in Moore County, the end of school is not so pleasure filled. It also means the interruption of guaranteed meals. The rise in food prices also magnifies the risk of food scarcity for these children and their families. The Coalition for Human Care has seen a significant rise in the need for food assistance the past few months, and they anticipate it increasing as schools close for the summer. Currently, they are serving, on average, 200 families per week.

Your continued food donations to the Coalition is a great way to offset this gap in essential nutrition. A recent conversation with the Coalition staff informed us of what is especially needed.

Consider the following:

1. Volunteer from 8:30 – 11 am once a week or once a month in their front office.
2. Donate nonperishable food items regularly; drop items in the baskets opposite the Church Office.
3. Diapers for older babies and pull ups for toddlers! (They receive plenty of infant diaper donations.)
4. Feminine hygiene products are also needed.

Thank you for all that you give. It truly has an impact!

The projects assigned to us are specific to the recovery progress as well as the gifts/talents of our group. Keep in mind that the chief talent is a willing heart to serve!

After that date, any unclaimed spots will be made available to the wider community and friends in neighboring churches who wish to serve. There will be an information session available in July 2026.

CALL Scholarships for 2026

Fund Objective: Consistent with CALL's mission, the purpose of the CALL Scholarship is to support higher education (e.g., community college, a trades education program, college, or university) by providing scholarships to CALL students and mothers who are or have been active participants in CALL.

CALL students may be seniors in high school or already in college, a university, or trade programs. Scholarship recipients will be eligible to reapply for a grant in subsequent years. The amount of scholarship money available will be based on the tuition costs or fees associated with the course of study and should not exceed \$5,000 annually. Amounts may be paid for the Summer Session and also the Fall and Spring Semester. Recipients expected GPA is a 2.5 or above.

This year we have four students who are recipients of our CALL Scholarships. They are Arely, Michelle, Alex, and Lisset.



Arely was awarded her Associate in Science at SCC on May 15. In January she entered UNC-

Charlotte where she will study Health Systems Management with a goal of working in the field of optometry. During the summer and holiday breaks, Arely works at Carolina Eye.



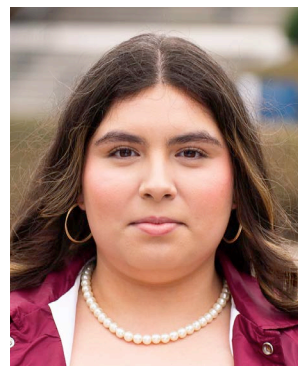
Michelle is a second year student at SCC. Michelle is majoring in accounting and finance.
