#### LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

Leader: We light the candles on this Advent wreath acknowledging the coming of

Christ. It is significant that the church has always used that language-the coming of Christ-because it speaks to a deep truth. Christ is coming. Christ is always coming, always entering a troubled world, a wounded heart.

Today we light the candle of Hope. With this light, we remember the hope that God gives to us, the promise of a Savior who brings light to our darkness.

In Isaiah 9:2, we hear, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined."

May this light be a reminder that God's hope shines brightly even in the darkest places, guiding us as we wait in hope for Christ's coming. We light the candle of hope, and dare to

In the presence of a forgiving God,
We become aware of the ways we fall short of God's best hopes for us, and ways we have hurt others.
As you pray the prayer of confession; think how the words express specific sins in your life and the life of the church. We turn to God asking forgiveness.

Claim the truth that through God's grace and Christ giving of himself on the cross, we are forgiven. Let this truth set you free from your sins so you may be restored to God and one another.

All children are invited to come forward for the Children's Moment.

The Scripture bears witness to the word of God. Listen beyond the human word for the Word of God. Pray that the Spirit will speak to you through the text.

All Scripture is Godbreathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.
